SPECIAL NEEDS DOCUMENTATION

Children and youth requiring rescue medications for a respiratory diagnosis, allergies (food/environmental), diabetes, and/or seizures will require a CYS Medical Action Plan specific to those needs. Children and youth that have a medical or religious reason for a food substitution will need a CYS Special Diet Statement. All Medical Action Plans must be completed by a Health Care Provider, stamped & signed within the last 365 days of the registration date. Parents may be asked to provide copies of IEP, IFSP, or other documentation based on the child or youth's needs. Special Diet Statements for Religious exemption requires signature of Representative of Religious Institution/Chaplain.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTERS (CDC)

FULL-DAY CARE

The CDC provides a total enrichment program that is developmentally appropriate for children 6 weeks to 5 years. Caregivers are loving and well-trained. This program is designed to meet the needs of working parents. Costs for full-day care are based on total family income. Care is offered Monday through Friday 5:30 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.

PART-DAY PRESCHOOL

This program is designed to meet the developmental and learning needs of children who are 3 to 5 years old. Three hour sessions are offered two, three and four days per week from September through May.

HOURLY CARE

Short-term care is offered for children 6 weeks to 5 years old, on a space available basis. Hourly care is offered from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm Mondays through Friday. Reservations are accepted up to 28 days in advance.

STRONG BEGINNINGS PRE-K

Full day and part day Strong Beginnings Pre-Kindergarten classes are offered. This program is for children who will be in kindergarten the following school year.

FAMILY CHILD CARE (FCC)

Family Child Care is designed to meet the needs of parents who prefer a small group setting in a home environment. CYS certified providers offer care for children in their homes on post. Extensive training is required to qualify for certification. Fire, safety and health department inspect all FCC homes and all provider family members over the age of 12 must pass a thorough background check. Each FCC home operates as a small business and fees are 10% lower than CDC rates. FCC offers full-day, part-day, hourly and extended hours care.

SCHOOL AGE CARE (SAC)

SAC offers consolidated, before and after school supervision and activities for children in K through 5th grades. Technology lab activities, instruction and homework assistance are also available, Hours of care are 5:30 am - 8:00 am and from 3:30 pm - 6:00 pm on school days and from 5:30 am - 6:00 pm on non school days. Transportation is provided to and from on post school. SAC offers summer camp for children having completed grades K through 5. The program is also associated with Boys and Girls Clubs of America and 4-H.

HARROLD YOUTH CENTER (HYC)

HYC is the home of Youth Services (YS) programs for eligible youth in 6th-12th grades. YS also offers the Middle School/Teen (MST) program with recreational activities, clubs, a homework center and technology lab. Even if your child attends an offpost school, we may provide transportation to the youth center. A daily snack is also provided. The after school program is offered at no cost to families registered with CYS. Youth Services is an affiliate of the Boy and Girls Clubs of America and 4-H and utilizes their programs and scholarship opportunities.
