INFORMATION, REFERRAL & FOLLOW-UP

Information, referral, and follow-up services on available resources in the Fort Leavenworth area. Soldiers (retired and active), National Guard, Reservists, and their Family Members with ID cards are eligible for services.

RELOCATION READINESS (RELO)

Assistance is available for Soldiers and Family Members moving to or arriving from another military duty station. Our **LOAN CLOSET** is available with kitchen items, sleep mats, tables, chairs and baby furniture (30 day loan).

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

Multi-level conversational English classes.

EMPLOYMENT READINESS

Provides a link between job openings in the local community and on-post. Resume Writing, Interviewing Techniques, and Self-Assessment workshops are available.

ARMY VOLUNTEER CORPS

Fort Leavenworth volunteer opportunities and volunteer placement in installation agencies/programs.

FAMILY ADVOCACY PROGRAM (FAP)

Specialized programs that focuses on the prevention of child and spouse maltreatment to include Victim Advocacy and Sexual Assault.

NEW PARENT SUPPORT PROGRAM (NPSP)

Provides emotional support, parent education, and referrals to community resources for parents with newborns.

VICTIM ADVOCATE PROGRAM

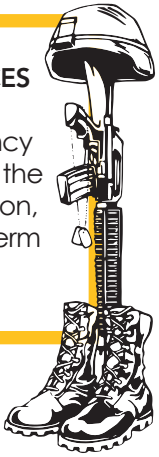
Provides initial contact and advocacy for Families involved in domestic violence.

EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER PROGRAM (EFMP)

Department of Army program designed to assist the active duty Soldier, who has a special need Family Member with a physical, emotional, or intellectual disorder. EFMP provides information, referrals, crisis intervention, respite care, and acts as an advocate for the Soldiers and their Families.

SURVIVOR OUTREACH SERVICES (SOS)

Provides holistic and multi-agency support services to Families of the Fallen including benefit coordination, financial counseling and long-term case management.



ARMY FAMILY TEAM BUILDING (AFTB)

AFTB offers educational classes to help Spouses and Soldiers become accustomed and familiar with the Army. Level I is your Army basics. Level II takes you into time/



stress management and coping skills. Level III helps you build your individual leadership skills.

ARMY FAMILY ACTION PLAN (AFAP)

The Army Family Action Plan provides a way for Soldiers, Family Members, Retirees & Civilians to let Army leadership know what works, what does not, and what they think will fix it. AFAP is the driving force of improving standards of living for all members of the Army Community.

FINANCIAL READINESS

Offers education, information and assistance in consumer issues, financial, family budgeting, and debt management matters.

ARMY EMERGENCY RELIEF (AER)

AER provides no-interest loans to active and retired Soldiers and their dependent Family Members for emergencies in the areas of rent/mortgage, emergency travel, food, utilities, essential car repairs, funeral expenses, etc.

MOBILIZATION & DEPLOYMENT

Provides training and referrals to units, Soldiers, and Family Members to promote readiness for mission related separations. Pre and post-deployment briefings are provided to ensure that Family Members know what services are available and how they may be accessed.

MILITARY FAMILY LIFE CONSULTANTS (MFLC)

Licensed professionals, who assist Soldiers and Family Members, with a personalized action plan to address issues or concerns.
