PRIVATE PILOT LICENSE

Who can get a private pilot license?

Anyone who can take and pass the FAA written and practical exams and can meet the following criteria may get a private pilot license:

- 17 years of age or older
- Pass FAA Class III physical exam
- Read, speak, and understand English

What can I do with a private pilot license?

In good weather conditions, your private pilot license lets you fly and carry passengers in most single-engine, land-based airplanes. Private pilots are authorized to fly in and out of any public airport in the United States.

How long does it take to get a private pilot license?

The minimum amount of flight time the FAA requires before a student can take the practical exam is 40 hours. However the national average is closer to 65 - 70 hours.

If a student flies an average of 2 hours a week, it would take approximately 20 weeks to build the required time. The key to finishing more quickly is to keep your ground school paced with your lessons and fly frequently and regularly.
