plus top 2 female cadets win Ultimate Raider Challenge

FORT KNOX, Kentucky — The JROTC National Raider Challenge, hosted by U.S. Army Cadet Command, brought nearly 4,000 cadets from across the country to Fort Knox Oct. 24-27 to test their grit and attempt to bring home the title of National Raider Champion.

"This is an opportunity to see

While this was an event for high school students, it was not for the faint of heart. The competition featured grueling obstacle courses, a five-kilometer run, and the infamous one rope bridge, among other challenging tasks. Despite how overwhelming this competition may seem to some, JROTC cadets who had been training for months accepted the challenge. The competition is divided into three divisions – Challenge, Masters and All-Service.

The Challenge division competed on Friday and is comparable to junior varsity in other high school sports, with teams being made up of younger or less experienced cadets.

The Masters division competed on Saturday and is the equivalent of var-

Each year the Veterans Day National Committee publishes a commemorative Veterans Day poster. The committee selects a poster from artwork submitted by artists nationwide.

Over the years these posters have illustrated the rich history of our country's service men and women. The poster reflects our pride and patriotism in saluting veterans while providing the thematic artistry for the year.

The theme for Veterans Day 2024 is "A Legacy of Loyalty and Service," and this year's winning poster was designed by Myisha Godette, a retired, disabled Army veteran from Queens, New York.

Godette's design was

driven by a desire to represent all who have served.

"As a veteran, I've sometimes felt underrepresented, prompting me to consider how best to incorporate inclusivity and the essence of loyalty and service," she said. "Ultimately, I chose to symbolize the shared experience of service members — past, present, and future - with elements like the American flag, military "dog tags," and the enduring strength of veterans, embodied by a solid, dark concrete background in my design."





2025 Veterans Day poster contest SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Submissions must be a representation of the diversity of all veterans who have served.

The committee may select a particular submission but ask the artist to modify the original design. Additional changes may be required prior to printing.

Artwork must be 18-inches by 24-inches at 300 dots per inch; scale down submissions to 9-inches by 12 inches.

The design will also be used for a 1-inch by 1.5inch lapel pin. Simple designs look best scaled down to lapel pins.

If artists would like to submit a modified design for the lapel pin based on the original poster design, they may do so.

Submissions are not restricted to "human-centric" images, such as a joint color guard. Images of American icons, monuments or scenery can qualify.

Each design must include the words "Veterans Day," "November 11, 2025," and "Honoring all who served."

All submissions must include sufficient information to demonstrate that the image is the artist's work.

If the submission contains elements (such as photographs, illustrations and/or concepts) drawn from copyrighted material, then the artist must include a transferable license showing granted rights to the item's inclusion and use.

Successful designs are simple, with minimal imagery and verbiage.

Submit electronic versions as JPG images or PDF files by e-mail to vetsday@va.gov.

The deadline for submissions is April 1, 2025.

The Veterans Day National Committee will review submissions in May 2025 to select the winning design.

Fort Leavenworth's health director visited with members of the Leavenworth community at Leavenworth High School's Army Junior ROTC Pancake Breakfast and Holiday Shoot Nov. 2 in Leavenworth.

"So often we see our community members at the health center when they may not be feeling their best. So, it is nice to get out here and meet with them in their space," said Col. Jolanda L.J. Walker, director of Munson Army Health Center and commander of Medical Department Activity.

Increasing community engagement, on and off post, is among Walker's top priorities, in addition to improved access to care and readiness.

"We are a health center, but this community is where our patients, team members, TRICARE-network partners, and their families live. These relationships matter and can improve readiness and healthcare delivery, so it is important to nurture them," Walker said.

To her point, Walker met high school senior and JROTC cadet Sydney Eakin at the event. Eakin shared that she enjoys science and wants to pursue a career in research but she didn't know where that might fall in the Army.

Walker told the student about the U.S. Army Medical Research and Development Command at Fort Detrick, Maryland, currently commanded by Maj. Gen. Paula Lodi.

"(General Lodi) was my boss at my last assignment. She is an amazing leader and responsible for an organization focused on various areas of biomedical research," Walker said. "There are six medical research labs that investigate medical solutions for the battlefield. The critical expertise in these areas helps ensure the Army has the medical capabilities it needs to fight and win on the battlefield."

Walker said the chance encounter as one example of successful engagement.

"We need to get out here and make sure this younger generation knows these opportunities exist," Walker said.

During the event, Walker received a tour of the JROTC classroom, before heading to the school's indoor air rifle range where she learned about the air rifle the high school's JROTC cadets use for competitions and even gave it a try.

JROTC Cadet Terry Mathy told Walker about the different features and their functions before allowing her to take aim at a target.

"She had a good stance and hit the target," Mathy said.

Afterward, he spoke more with the colonel about his JROTC unit and his goals after high school, which included Plans A and B.

"I would really like to go to West Point, and I am currently working on getting my application together," said the high school junior, who also competes on the academic team.

Mathy has been active in JROTC since his freshman year, and even constructed a new locker system for the team's equipment as part of his Eagle Scout project.

"I think it's awesome to see the commander supporting community events, especially for the youth. The air rifle team is one of the smaller teams (at LHS), and their funding was cut this year significantly," said Rachel Mathy, Cadet Mathy's mother and MAHC team member.

"We did not plan this, but as

soon as I walked up to the event, I recognized Ms. Mathy from Munson," Walker said with a laugh. "She sold me a ticket this morning."

Walker rounded out her visit with a plate of pancakes and syrup back in the JROTC classroom.

"Just sitting down to have some pancakes, I ran into more team members from our pharmacy and met some of their families. I met other attendees who work on the post and receive care at Munson or on the (TRICARE) network. I even met grown adults who were once military children and remember receiving care at Munson," Walker said. "We are ingrained within this community, and I look forward to more opportunities to get out and experience it."

Operated under the Defense Health Agency, MAHC cares for more than 13,000 Military Health System beneficiaries, offering core services to beneficiaries through a primary care practice supported by pharmacy, laboratory, optometry, public health, mental health, physical therapy and radiology services. Services also include Smith Dental Clinic and the Fort Leavenworth Armed Forces Wellness Center.

MAHC supports the U.S. Army Combined Arms Center mission in preparing the Army to win in large-scale combat operations. They also provide an around-theclock medical mission at the Military Corrections Complex, which features the only maximum-security facility in the Department of Defense.

sity with teams comprised of primarily upper classmen who typically have years of Raider experience.

Competing alongside the Master divisions were JROTC programs from the



Air Force, Navy and Marine Corps, who were slated in the All-Service Division.

Once the Masters and All-Service divisions concluded, the top finishing teams nominated two cadets to represent their school in the Ultimate Raider Challenge — a three-mile course broken up into an 800-meter sprint, a 14-station obstacle course, a 25-meter swim and a two-mile run. The results from the Ultimate Raider Challenge were then combined with their overall scores from Saturday's events to create the final standings for the competition.

During the final awards ceremony, the top 12 finishers of the Ultimate Raider Challenge - which included LHS JROTC cadets junior Elisabeth Howell, a three-time national champion, and senior Katherine Schwennesen, a two-time national champion — were each presented a four-year Army ROTC scholarship. These scholarships will allow the cadets to continue their education at their school of choice with an Army ROTC program, provided that they meet the minimum requirements and choose to serve as an officer in the Army.
