INFORMATION, REFERRAL & FOLLOW-UP

Information, referral, and follow-up services on available resources in the Fort Leavenworth area. Soldiers (retired and active), National Guard, Reservists, and their Family Members with ID cards are eligible for services.

RELOCATION READINESS (RELO)

Assistance is available for Soldiers and Family Members moving to or arriving from another military duty station. Our **LOAN CLOSET** is available with kitchen items, sleep mats, tables, chairs and baby furniture (30 day loan).

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

Multi-level conversational English classes for adults and children.

EMPLOYMENT READINESS

Provides a link between job openings in the local community and on-post. Resume Writing, Basic Interviewing Techniques, and Self-Assessment workshops are available.

ARMY VOLUNTEER CORPS

The Army Volunteer Corps is the center of volunteer recruitment, referral, recognition and advocacy efforts. Through volunteer service individuals can learn or enhance skill, get to know the community, build their resumes, and more.

FAMILY ADVOCACY PROGRAM (FAP)

Specialized programs that focuses on the prevention of child and spouse maltreatment to include Victim Advocacy and Sexual Assault.

NEW PARENT SUPPORT PROGRAM (NPSP)

Provides emotional support, parent education, and referrals to community resources for parents with children aged 0 - 3 years.

VICTIM ADVOCATE PROGRAM

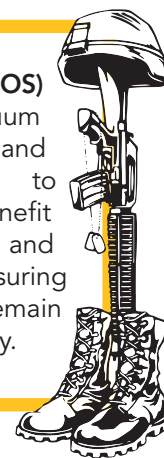
Provides initial contact and advocacy for Families involved in domestic violence.

EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER PROGRAM (EFMP)

Working in concert with other military and civilian agencies, EFMP provides a comprehensive, coordinate, multi-agency approach to community support, advocacy, housing, medical, educational, and personal services to Families with special needs.

SURVIVOR OUTREACH SERVICES (SOS)

Part of the Army Casualty Continuum of Care, SOS provides holistic and multi-agency support services to Families of the Fallen including benefit coordination, financial counseling and long-term case management, ensuring that Survivors know that they remain valued members of the Army Family.



FINANCIAL READINESS

Offers education, information and assistance in consumer issues, financial & retirement planning, family budgeting, and debt management matters.

ARMY EMERGENCY RELIEF (AER)

AER provides no-interest loans and grants to active and retired Soldiers and their dependent Family Members for emergencies in the areas of rent/mortgage, emergency travel, food, utilities, essential car repairs, funeral expenses, etc.

MOBILIZATION & DEPLOYMENT

Provides training and referrals to units, Soldiers, and Family Members to promote readiness for mission related separations. Pre and post-deployment briefings are provided to ensure that Family Members know what services are available and how they may be accessed.

MILITARY FAMILY LIFE CONSULTANTS (MFLC)

Licensed professionals, who assist Soldiers and Family Members, with a personalized action plan to address issues or concerns.



ARMY FAMILY TEAM BUILDING (AFTB)

AFTB offers educational classes to help Spouses and Soldiers become accustomed and familiar with the Army. Seminar subjects include: Military Knowledge, Personal Growth and Resiliency, and Leadership Development.

FIELD GRADE SPOUSES SEMINARS

The workshop's focus is on up-to-date practical information, possible expectations, opportunities and resources that will connect you to the Army during your Soldier's Field Grade Years.

ARMY FAMILY ACTION PLAN (AFAP)

The Army Family Action Plan provides a way for Soldiers, Family Members, Retirees & Civilians to let Army leadership know what works, what does not, and what they think will fix it. AFAP is the driving force of improving standards of living for all members of the Army Community.
